# Achieve Registration Form Privacy Notice

This notice is about how we use information about you and how we will keep it safe. We call this information about you 'personal data' or 'personal information.' If this notice is difficult for you to understand, you can ask your parents, or another adult such as your teacher to help you understand it.

### Who we are

Achieve is part of The Woodsmith Education Programme. It is an exciting opportunity for young people in North Yorkshire and Redcar & Cleveland which aims to support their personal development and wellbeing. It is funded and managed by Anglo American and the Woodsmith Foundation and developed in conjunction with your school.

# What information we will collect about you?

The information we will collect and hold about you includes: who you are, what school you attend; your attendance levels; if you have any special needs; how well you achieve at school; if you are a young carer, care leaver or a looked after child; if you are eligible for free school meals and/or pupil premium.

We will collect information about your participation in activities within the programme. We may also collect data on your feelings and challenges to help us shape the programme and activities to meet your needs. This information is collected directly from yourself, your family and from your school.

# What will we do with your information?

The information we collect from you and from our partners in the programme will be used to assess the effectiveness and impact of our programme as a legitimate interest – this is because we want to make sure we are making a difference and helping you to reach your potential.

We will use the information to track your participation in the programme for research, monitoring and evaluation purposes. This means that we will review your data at different times during your participation in the programme so that we can see what difference it is making to you.

We may contact you from time to time to invite you to events related directly to the programme.

We will also use the information to enable us to deliver a good service to you.

We only collect information about you with your permission. We will ask for this consent (and/or the consent of your parent or carer) when you register for the programme. You can withdraw this consent at any time simply by telling us; but if we cannot hold or share information about you, it will mean that you are not able to participate further in the programme.

# Who will see the information and what information will be collected by them?

We need to share the information with some trusted partners in order that the programme meets your needs. Information may be shared with, and collected by, the following organisations who are involved in the programme, in order that they can deliver their services and to provide monitoring, evaluation, and statistical support:

We will not release the data to anyone who is not authorised to receive it, nor for any commercial use. Any data shared for research, monitoring and evaluation purposes will be anonymised.

Sometimes we may need to share your data with other trusted people involved in your life or care. We will only do this if it is absolutely necessary. Examples of trusted people we may need to share your data with are health workers, social workers/social services, youth workers, the police, or your school. If you tell us something that makes us think you are in danger, we will have to tell the relevant authorities. When we do this, it is because we have to follow the law.

# Audio/visual recordings -

From time to time we may take photographs and videos of our participants in the programme to show how great the programme is and put these in printed materials or on the web. This will mean that videos and images will be available to anyone on the internet.

We will ask for your permission to use recordings and images of you separately on the registration form. By giving consent to participating in our photographs and video recordings (programme testimonials), you give Anglo American the right to use your image, in video or still, and of the likeness and sound of your voice as recorded on audio or video tape.

We won't use these images for profit – and so when we use them, we cannot offer any financial rewards for the use of those images, so make sure you're OK with that and check this with your parents. If you have not given your consent on the registration form, we will not use your image in this way.

# How will we keep your information safe?

We are committed to protecting the security of the personal information which we collect about you. In support of this commitment, we have implemented a range of technical, physical, and organisational controls to ensure an appropriate level of security in place over your data. For example, we make sure that our delivery partners have adequate security in place to protect your data and we put contracts in place with our partners to ensure that the data is used appropriately and where it is transferred outside the UK that it will be looked after.

# How long will we keep your information?

We will store the data for no longer than 8 years. We keep the data this long in order to ascertain if the programme has had an impact on progression through education and into employment.
